CALL TO WORSHIP – LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH (The Candle of Joy)

We have lit the first two candles, one for hope and one for peace. Today we light the third candle, the candle of joy. This should be the easy one, because joy is all around us—in the children, the lights, the music, the gathering together.
